
Lesson Excerpt: Details, Questions, and Conclusions

Purpose/Objective:

Students learn about Reformation, Counter-Reformation, and Popular Sovereignty, including important people and writings, which would influence migration to America and early Americans.

Suggested Reading:

Chapter 1 of *Miracle of America* sourcebook/text. Students read sections 1.1. and 1.2.

321 DQC

Teacher checks for student understanding of reading & instruction by having students work through the content information and record “details, questions, and conclusions” for each reading section based on what they’ve learned after they have read, taken notes, and reviewed any instruction/presentations. An example would be to ask students to list “321 DQC” - 3 details, 2 questions, 1 conclusion. This activity may be repeated on several days during the unit as needed and as time allows. This activity may serve as a formative assessment.
